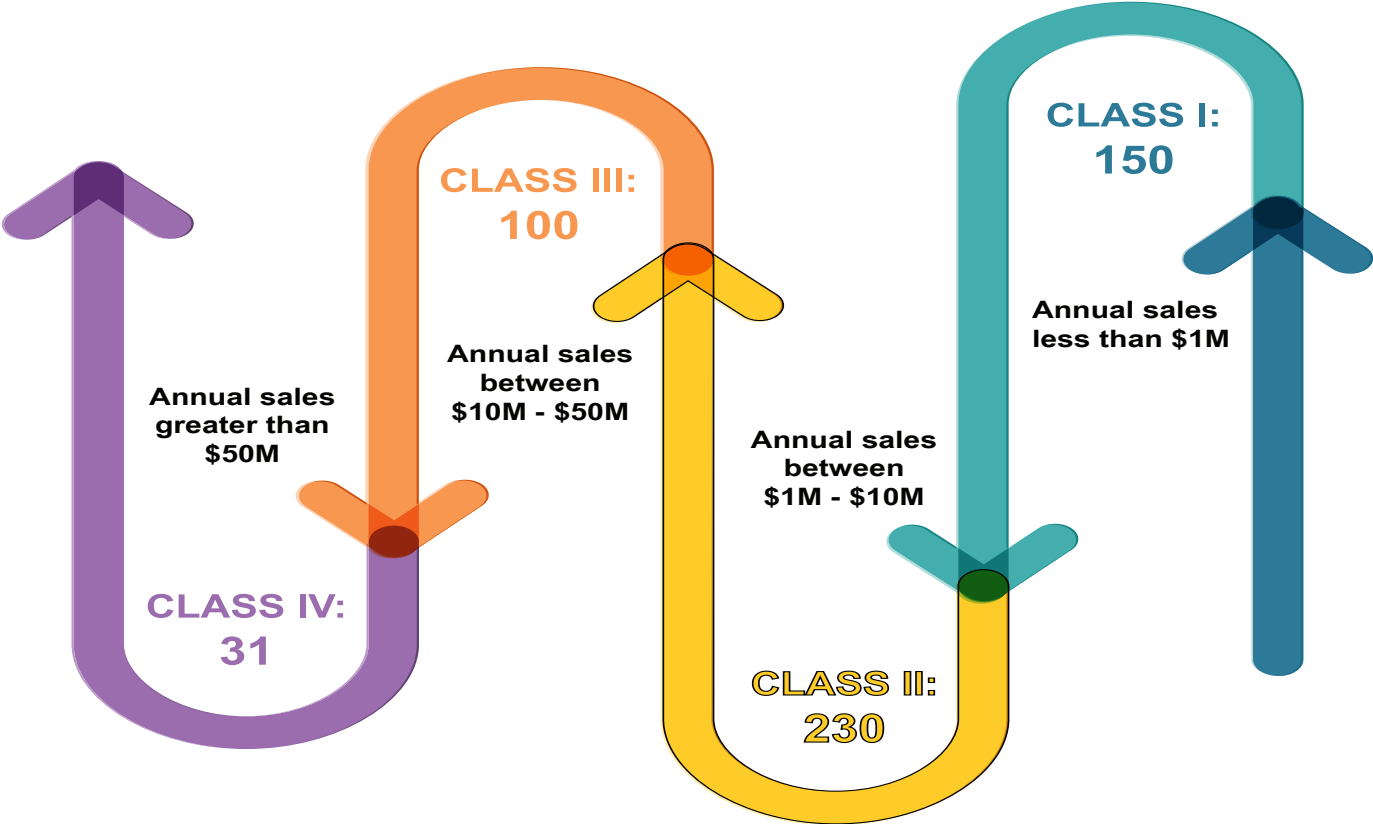
SMSDC connected 511 Certified MBEs to 21 corporations (including 6 national and 15 local corporate members).

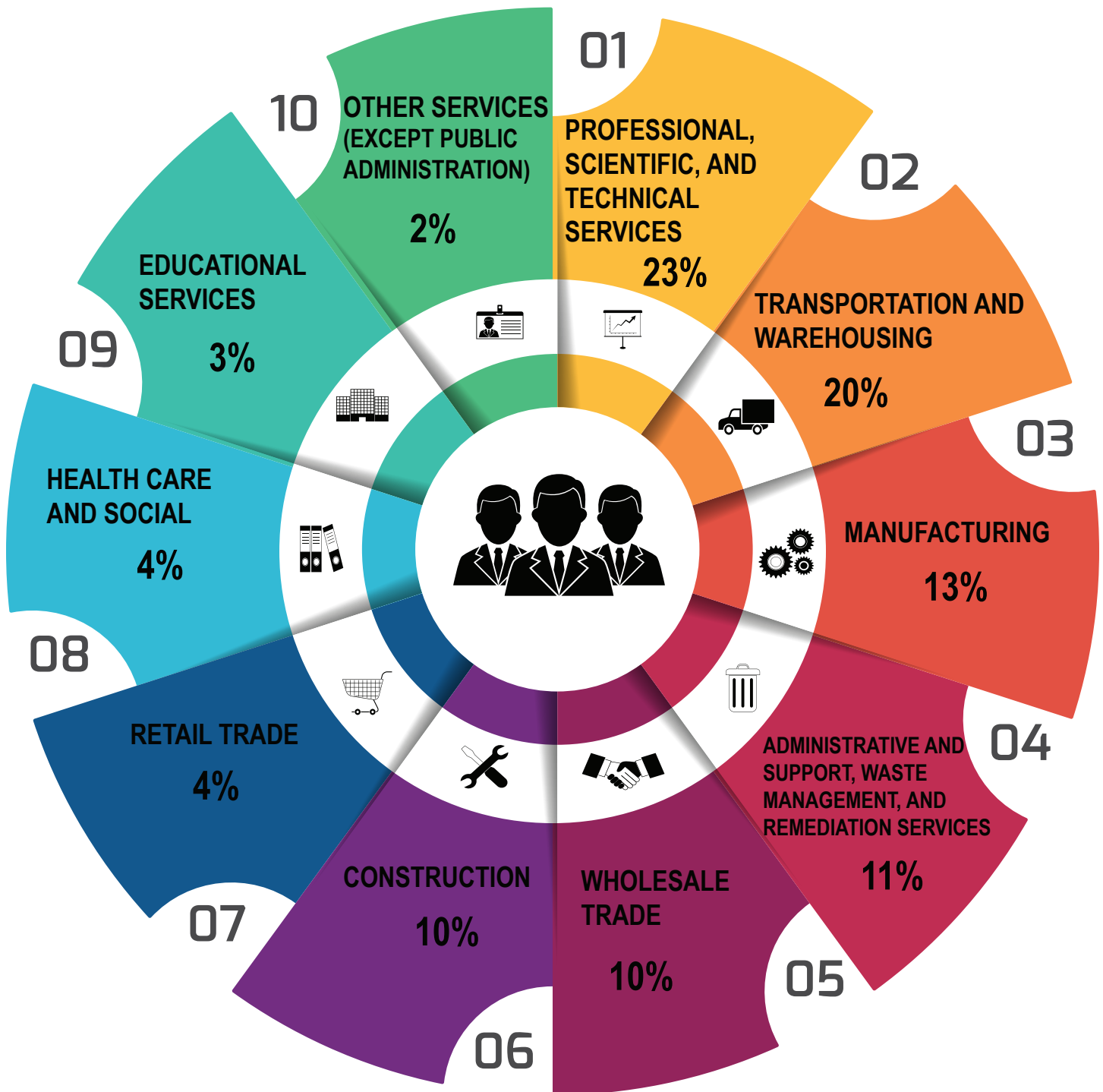

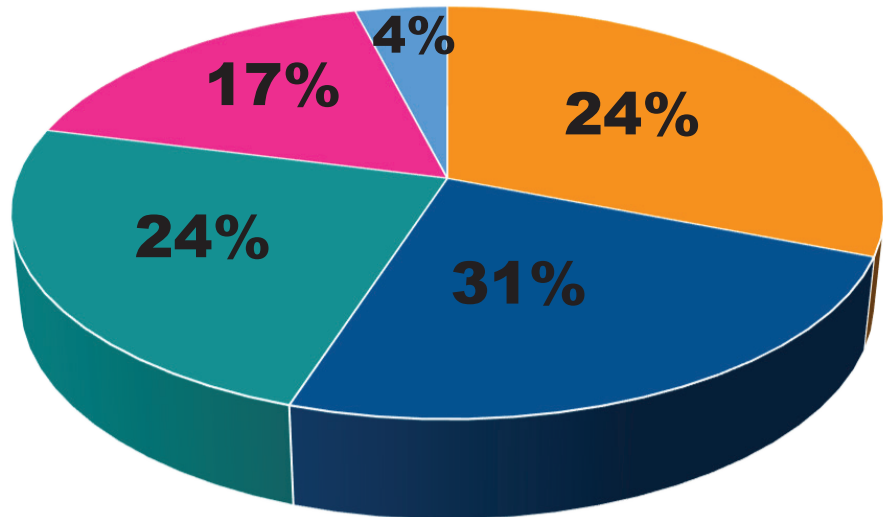
TOP 10 INDUSTRY GROUPS

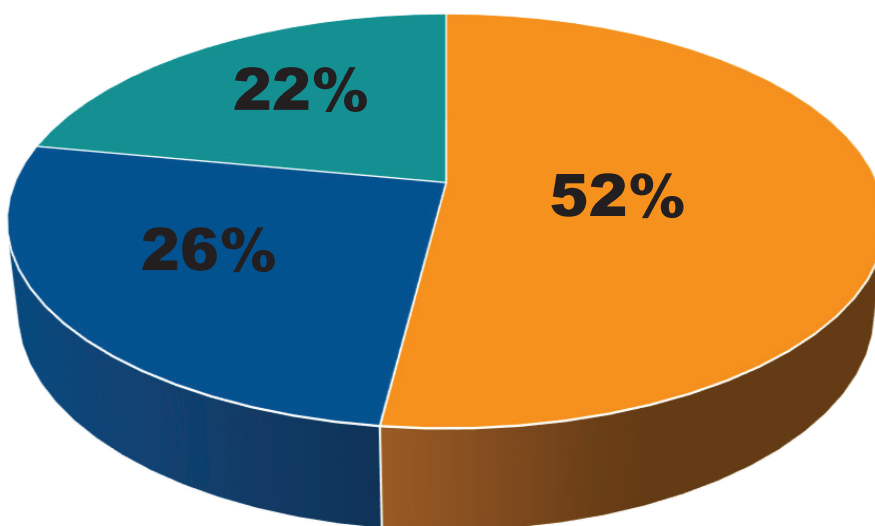
